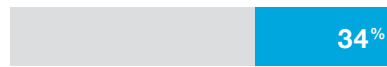


Top 10 employee findings

The **Aflac WorkForces Report** examines benefits trends and attitudes among employees and employers.



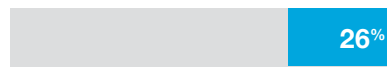
55% of employees are at least somewhat likely to take a job with lower pay but better benefits.



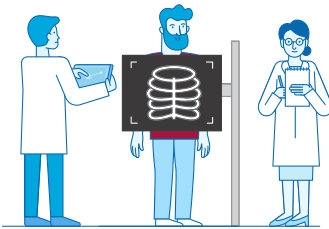
of employees say improving their benefits package is one thing their employer could do to keep them in their jobs.



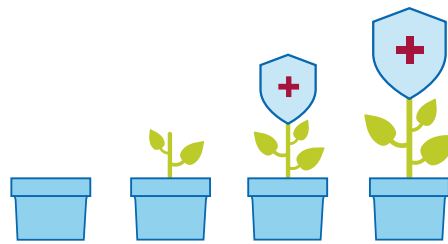
of employees would be at least somewhat likely to purchase supplemental insurance if it were offered at work.



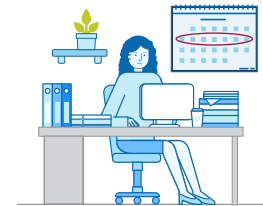
of workers have left or turned down a job due to the benefits offered.



26% of workers have avoided going to the doctor due to high medical costs.



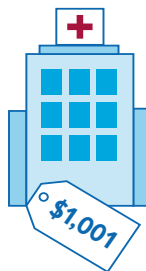
85% of workers see a growing need for supplemental insurance benefits.



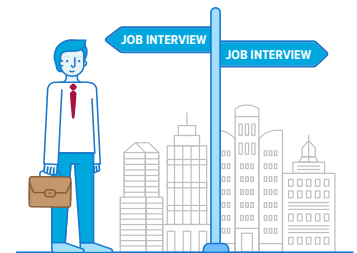
20% of employees say they could only go one week without a paycheck.
